1) Special Notes

Not all page templates are the same

For optimization, if a page isn't using the slideshow banner, we aren't loading the script for that. Similarly, if a page isn't using the lightbox, the CSS and JS files for the lightbox have been omitted. Because of this, we encourage you to keep this in mind during your customization, and possibly even create a duplicate folder where original page templates can be stored for reference.

Pretty Photo has been modified

We love how robust PrettyPhoto is, but we're also picky about things, and as a result, have modified a good deal of the core PrettyPhoto code. For example, PrettyPhoto would preload all images in order to create the small thumbnail strip once you enter the lightbox. We didn't really like this that much, as some galleries can have a large number of photos and large sized photos that take a while to download. So we thought it made

more sense to create the small thumbnail strip from the original thumbnails that were already loaded in cache. And because they're much smaller images, they allow for better scale quality. But because of this enhancement, we had to make a sacrifice: The lightbox requires an original thumbnail to work properly. This means text **links that trigger the lightbox are not supported**.

The main content section is positioned horizontally with JavaScript.

If you resize the browser down to 1024x768, you'll notice the main content area still fits nicely between the menu and the right side of the screen. Unfortunately this required some math, which in turned required some JavaScript. But the script automatically grabs the width of the menu, so you don't have to worry about editing any script.

The template uses [HTML5 Boilerplate](#) for help with cross browser compatibility.

The boilerplate CSS file does not need to be edited and in general can be ignored. But the following files are required on each page for HTML5 Boilerplate (and the template) to work correctly.

- `css/boilerplate.css`
- `js/libs/modernizr-1.7.min.js`

IE7 and HTML Comments

When you start working with the template you'll notice the HTML files are heavily commented. I did, however, find an instance in IE7 where a main menu comment was actually affecting its layout. If you experience anything similar, remove all HTML comments in IE7.

2) Cufon Fonts Used / Changing Fonts

- The template uses two Cufon for non-device fonts. The can be found here:

- The Cufon is setup inside the JavaScript file named *"royale-cufon.js"*.
- The individual font scripts are located inside the following folder: `js > fonts`
- All other device fonts used are declared in the CSS file named `"style.css"`

3) Changing Background Colors

All changes listed take place in the file named *"style.css"*

- Navigation background color:
 - #left
 - #left nav li > ul
- Main content background color:
 - #content
- Footer background color:
 - #content footer
- Copyright background color:
 - #content #copyright

4) Changing the width of the menu

Inside the file named *"style.css"*, the following CSS rules need to be updated to change the menu width.

- #left
- #left #logo
- #left nav li > ul

When the menu width is changed, the main content area's left margin should be adjusted to center the main content between the menu and the right side of the page. This can be found in the *#content* CSS rule. The number can be calculated as follows:

```
margin-left = -((#content width / 2) - (nav width / 2))
```

5) Background Image Settings

- **url:** *the url to your background image*
- **scaleFrom:** *options are "topLeft" and "center"*

6) Adding the Background Slideshow to a Page w/ Content

- Add between the head tags:
 - `<link rel="stylesheet" type="text/css" href="css/bg-slideshow.css?v=1" />`
 - `<script src="js/royale-bg-slideshow.js" type="text/javascript"></script>`
- Copy the "**BG SLIDESHOW**" portion of the script at the top of the *"bg_slideshow_with_content.html"* file.
- Copy the div with the id *"bg-slideshow"* into the body of your page. Should be placed right after the body tag (or after the `<noscript>` section).
- Background Slideshow Settings:
 - **indexDeepLinks:** *help Google index your image deep-links, true/false*
 - **autoPlay:** *autoplay the slideshow, true/false*
 - **scaleType:** *options are "stretch", "stretch-center" and "fit" (never crop)*
 - **randomizeImages:** *randomize the background images, true/false*
 - **transitionDelay:** *the delay between image changes in milliseconds*
 - **disableRightClick:** *choose to disable right-click to help protect your images*

7) Adding the Banner Slideshow to a Page

- Add between the head tags:
 - `<script src="js/libs/jquery.clip-animation.min.js" type="text/javascript"></script>`
 - `<script src="js/libs/jquery.easing.1.3.min.js" type="text/javascript"></script>`
 - `<script src="js/royale-slide-show.js" type="text/javascript"></script>`
- Copy the "**BANNER SLIDESHOW**" portion of the script at the top of the *"single_info_text.html"* file.
- In the body section of the *"single_info_text.html"* file, copy the div with the id *"top-slideshow"* and everything inside it. Paste the contents directly below the *"header"* found right after the tag `<div id="container">`
- Banner Slideshow Settings:

- **imageWidth:** *the total width of the images (all images must be the same size)*
- **imageHeight:** *the total height of the images (all images must be the same size)*
- **autoPlay:** *choose to auto-play the slideshow, true/false*
- **autoPlayDelay:** *the auto-play delay in milliseconds*
- **flashVideoSwf:** *the url to the HTML5 video fall-back swf*
- **vimeoSkinColor:** *the skin hex color for Vimeo video (if the video allows it)*
- **useText:** *If text is being used, true/false*
- **textMargin:** *the margin between the slideshow and info text if used*
- **textAlign:** *choose to align the text to the left or right side of the image, options: "left" or "right"*

• Adding Media to the Banner

- Each slideshow item is represented by a `` item. Inside the list item is where possible info text would go (see `"slide_info_text"` for an example of this). But the title attribute of the `` item is where the item's media data is entered. The title attribute accepts the 4 parameters listed below:
 - **image:** *the slideshow image*
 - **media:** *an additional video to play (optional)*
 - **link:** *the hyperlink url of the slide (optional)*
 - **target:** *the hyperlink window target (optional)*
- **Image only example:**
`title="image=img/pages/slide11.jpg"`
- **YouTube Video Example:**
`title="image=img/pages/slide14.jpg&media=http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=gS04RXw_M8s"`
- **Vimeo Video Example:**
`title="image=img/pages/slide13.jpg&media=http://vimeo.com/24492485"`
- **HTML5 Video Example:**
`title="image=img/pages/slide12.jpg&media=video/particlessmall.mp4"`
- **Hyperlink Example (can be added to the end of any list item, even ones with video)**
`title="image=img/pages/slide15.jpg&link=http://www.google.com&target=_blank"`

8) Adding LightBox thumbs to a Page

- Add between the head tags:
 - `<link rel="stylesheet" type="text/css" href="css/pretty-photo.css?v=1" />`
 - `<script src="js/libs/jquery.pretty-photo.js" type="text/javascript"></script>`
- Copy the "**LIGHTBOX SETTINGS**" portion of the script at the top of the *"gallery_three_column.html"* file.
- Copy the entire div with the class *"lightbox-thumb"* from the *"gallery_three_column.html"* file
- LightBox Settings:
 - **animationSpeed:** options are "fast", "slow" or "normal"
 - **opacity:** the transparency of the lightbox bg, accepts a value between 0 and 1
 - **defaultWidth:** default width for video
 - **defaultHeight:** default height for video
 - **showSmallThumbs:** show a small thumb gallery inside the lightbox, true/false
 - **maxVisibleSmallThumbs:** the number of thumbs to show before scrolling occurs, true/false
 - **modal:** make only the close button will close the window, true/false
 - **deeplinking:** enable deepLink urls for items, true/false
 - **keyboardShortcuts:** left/right keys can control slideshow, true/false
 - **flashVideoSwf:** the url to the fallback Flash video player swf
 - **vimeoSkinColor:** the Vimeo skin hex color (if the video allows it)
 - **showShareButtons:** true/false
- Adding YouTube Video as a Lightbox Item
 - Visit the YouTube video online and copy the url directly from the browser's address bar. Then clean up the url so it only contains the video url. Here is an example:

`http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=UoN2qtdE1YI`
 - The video width and height are then added to the end of the url like the example below:

`http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=UoN2qtdE1YI&width=640&height=360`
- Adding Vimeo Video as a Lightbox Item

- Visit the Vimeo video online and copy the url directly from the browser's address bar. Then clean up the url so it only contains the video url. Here is an example:

`http://vimeo.com/6686768`

- The video width and height are then added to the end of the url like the example below:

`http://vimeo.com/6686768?width=640&height=360`

- Adding HTML5 Video as a Lightbox Item

- **video/particles.mp4?width=670&height=360&custom=true**

1. The first part is the video url (must end with ".mp4")
2. The second part is the video width
3. The third part is the video height
4. The last part tells the lightbox that we will be using custom markup for the HTML5 video

9) Adding the Portfolio Thumb Slider to a Page

- Add between the head tags:
 - `<link rel="stylesheet" type="text/css" href="css/jquery.jscrollpane.css?v=1" />`
 - `<script src="js/libs/jquery.jscrollpane.min.js" type="text/javascript"></script>`
- Copy the body markup from the "*portfolio.html*" file.
- The `<article>` must have a "*portfolio*" class, ie: `<article class="portfolio">`

10) Adding the Contact Form to a Page

- Add between the head tags:
 - `<script src="js/royale-contact-form.js" type="text/javascript"></script>`
- Copy the "**CONTACT FORM SETTINGS**" portion of the script at the top of the "*contact.html*" file.

- In the body section of the *"contact.html"* file, copy the form with the class *"royale-form"* and paste the contents into your new page.
- Contact Form Settings:
 - **emptyTextMessage:** *the message that will preface a field error*
 - **emailErrorMessage:** *the email error message*
 - **successMessage:** *the form submit success message*
 - **contactPhpFile:** *the contact form's php file*
- Setting up the php file
 - Open the file named "contact.php" in the folder "bin". At the very top you will see the following settings. Nothing else needs to be changed.
 - **\$sendTo** = *your email address*
 - **\$subject** = *the email subject*
 - **\$greeting** = *the email body headline text*

11) Working with HTML5 Video

- All video url's entered in the slideshow and lightbox must end with *".mp4"*. 3 versions of every video are required for HTML5 video to work. These are *"mp4"*, *"ogv"* and *"webm"*. A free video converter can be downloaded here:

- Your server may not currently support HTML5 video formats. Below is an example of adding Theora video support to your server. The following line would be placed inside your server's *".htaccess"* file:

```
AddType video/ogg ogv
AddType video/webm .webm
AddType video/mp4 .mp4
```

- The Flash Fallback is handled automatically
